CONNECTING THROUGH OUR STORIES

The January Academy for Collegiate Officers looked wildly different than in years past. A year ago, 400 women gathered in a way that now feels so unfamiliar: crowded around tables, sharing conversations and meals in an Indianapolis hotel conference room.

This year saw all officers *virtually* attend Academy, including the new Director of Diversity, Equity and Inclusion collegiate leadership position, meaning **more than 1,500 officers gathered to learn, share and grow**.

"One of the best things to come from Virtual Academy was it allowed us to open the opportunity to each chapter's entire Executive Council," said Katie Jolley Abernathy, Executive Director for our Fraternity. "And in a year so full of extra challenges, it was important for us to elevate the training surrounding our newest officer's role, and reinforce our commitment to diversity, equity and inclusion."

An apt theme of "Stories" was woven throughout the conference. Keynote speakers from POLARIS Counseling & Consulting discussed, "The Stories we Tell Ourselves," challenging collegiate officers to explore the concept of imposter syndrome and to re-write their own story as a leader. The "Stories We Tell Each Other," a keynote from The Leadership and Training Studio, encouraged sisters to capitalize on the power of stories and to incorporate storytelling best practices. "The Stories We Share and Amplify," presented by The Second City Works, was a unique and entertaining keynote that asked collegiate leaders to use their voice and privilege to speak up and amplify the experiences of others.

"I think "Stories We Tell Ourselves" is the session I resonated with most," Sage Harris, Gamma Zeta-University of Memphis, told us. "Especially in my new executive position as Vice President of Recruitment, I definitely identify with the 75% of women who face imposter syndrome and not feeling the most confident in a new leadership role. However, after this session, I was able to identify my defenses and ways to break the cycle of imposter syndrome! Dr. Daryl Appleton and Jennifer Weaver-Breitenbecher kept the session so upbeat and informational. They were definitely a reason why I resonated so much with this session."

IRA DISTRIBUTION NEWS:

A growing number of sisters and friends are donating through these vehicles because of the ease and tax benefit. Always consult with a tax professional to discuss the options best for you.

IRA QCD is still here!

If you are 70 ½ or older, you may make a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) up to \$100,000 from your IRA accounts directly to a charity, including the Alpha Gamma Delta Foundation, without taking the distribution into taxable income.

IRA RMDs are back for 2021

Are you 72 or older? Required Minimum Distributions (RMD) from IRAs resume in 2021 after being waived for 2020 and are a great resource to support your philanthropic passion. Be sure to make your gift directly to a qualified charity including the Alpha Gam Foundation.

COVID ACT EXTENDS INCENTIVES FOR GIFTS THROUGH 2021

Extended under the CARES Act, an individual who doesn't itemize may deduct up to \$300 of charitable contributions, and a married couple who doesn't itemize may deduct up to \$600 of charitable contributions made in 2021. As before, only cash gifts to public charities (other than donor-advised funds and supporting organizations) qualify.

EQUITY EDUCATION FUND

Whether on Day of Giving or any other time, give a gift to the Foundation's Equity Education Fund. The fund supports Alpha Gamma Delta initiatives and programs which prepare our members as citizens and leaders of our diverse global community. The fund's priority focus is on educational issues related to racial equity. In addition to annual gifts, the Foundation is seeking donors interested in creating endowment support.
